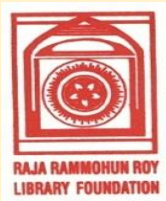

Notable alumni of the department have worked in different prestigious institutions on various positions. 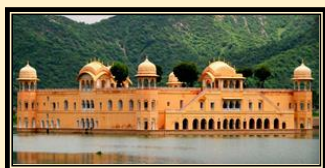
